

About the Prize

The annual **Bocas Lit Fest's Children's Book Prize** is a prize given to one English-language book for children, written by a Caribbean* author. The prize is administered by the Bocas Lit Fest, and sponsored by The Wainwright Family. It is awarded annually for the most outstanding contribution to Caribbean literature for young independent readers, ages 7 to 12.

The prize is open for entries from **20 June to 31 August 2022**. The winner will be announced in November 2022, and will receive a **US \$1,000.00** cash prize.

*See Appendix 1 for a list of territories which constitute the Caribbean for the purposes of this prize.

Judging

The prize is judged by an independent panel of children's literature experts. The chief judge is former librarian and storyteller from Trinidad and Tobago, Joan Osborne. The panel includes two other judges and a young reader who will join the adjudication process at the second stage and contribute to selecting the winner.

Eligibility & Entry Guidelines

Works of fiction (including short story collections and books in verse), literary nonfiction and graphic novels written for children **are** eligible. Works of drama, multiple-author anthologies, illustrated picture books, textbooks or instructional manuals **are not** eligible.

To be eligible for entry for the **2022** Prize, a book must:

 Be a new, original work written for children aged 7 - 12 published for the first time in book form between 1 August 2021 and 31 August 2022. Self-published books are eligible, and there is no requirement for the publisher or author to be based in the Caribbean;

- Have been written by a single author who either holds Caribbean citizenship or was born in the Caribbean (this must be verified by the publisher), regardless of current place of residence;
- Have been written by an author who is living on **31 August 2022**;
- Have been written and first published in English (i.e. translations are not eligible);
- Have an ISBN and be available for purchase in print (not e-book edition only);
- Tell the story primarily through prose rather than pictures or illustration. The book can include illustrations but should have a minimum word count of approximately 1,500 and should not rely on visual storytelling.

How to Enter

- Upload the final book file as a PDF that retains all book formatting. The book cover file can be submitted as a separate PDF.
- Books may be entered by their publisher OR author. The contact person identified on the entry form should be the person responsible for supplying copies of the book, should print copies be called in for judging or publicity.
- Authors and/or publishers of shortlisted titles must agree to provide three physical copies of the book to the Bocas Lit Fest.
- Each entry should be accompanied by a short biographical note on the author and a current headshot for publicity purposes.
- Books will be accepted for entry at the discretion of the chairs of the judging panels, who will determine questions of eligibility when necessary. Judges' decisions on eligibility are final. Non-eligible books and their entry fees will not be returned.
- There is a US\$15 entry fee that must accompany each submission.

Entry Fee

The entry fee of US\$15/TT\$100 per title can be paid by:

- Credit card payment via the online WiPay or Paypal platforms;
- US dollar bank drafts in amount of US\$15 (routed through a US-based bank) made payable to *The Bocas Lit Fest* and mailed via reliable courier service;
- Trinidad and Tobago online bank transfers in the amount of TT\$100.00. (Note: International wire transfers can only be accepted if the sender agrees to include the US\$13.25 bank fee).

Please select your preferred payment method when completing the online entry, and an invoice with details will be issued for payment. Payment must be received by the submission deadline in order for the book to be eligible.

DEADLINE

The publisher or author must submit the online form and pay the entry fee by 5:00PM (AST) on **31** August **2022**. The winner will be announced in November **2022**.
